The ITLOS Advisory Opinion on Climate Change and International Law

On May 21, 2024, the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea (ITLOS) issued an advisory opinion on the request submitted by the Commission on Small Island States on Climate Change and International Law (COSIS). The judges unanimously affirmed that anthropogenic emissions of greenhouse gases into the atmosphere constitute pollution of the marine environment within the meaning of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS). In addition, the Tribunal considered that the States parties to this Convention (169 to date), have particular obligations to protect and even anticipate the risks linked to the impacts of climate change and ocean acidification. According to the Tribunal, States parties have a high duty of care because the effects of climate change and acidification of the oceans represent serious and irreversible damage to the marine environment. Closely linked to the interpretation and application of UNCLOS provisions, the advisory opinion could serve as a important precedent for the other two undergoing consultative procedures before the International Court of Justice and the Inter-American Court of Human Rights.

The Faculty of Law of the University of Geneva, in collaboration with the International Law Seminar (UN), is organizing a reflection panel on this historic advisory opinion.
