SUSTAINABLE CONSUMPTION THROUGH THE LENS OF PLANETARY BOUNDARIES AND HUMAN WELL-BEING: A LIVING WELL WITHIN LIMITS APPROACH



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OVERVIEW

The challenge of achieving universal human development within planetary boundaries requires careful consideration of (1) the definition of a "good", happy or decent life; (2) the consumption requirements of well-being; (3) the context surrounding intra- and inter-national inequality, and the political dynamics and social processes that could enable the prioritisation of human well-being alongside limiting consumption within planetary boundaries.
