



Companies/institutions that agree to provide information for a Master Thesis do so freely. In doing so, they demonstrate their trust in the absolute discretion of the students and the University. To avoid any misunderstanding, candidates are reminded that:

- The proposals and conclusions of their work are their responsibility and in no way those of the University or its bodies; this must be stated on the cover page.
- The text, while remaining their property, must not be disseminated by any means without the express permission of the company/institution. If such authorization has been formally given, publication of the master thesis is nevertheless subject to the prior agreement of the Master Thesis director regarding the scientific and/or didactic aspects of the work.
- In the event of professional and/or commercial use of all or part of the Master Thesis, the intellectual property rights of the work shall normally remain with the author(s); the rights of the University and its representatives are nevertheless reserved.
- The student owes the company/institution a duty of confidence, the information communicated to her/him, as well as any information directly or indirectly concerning the company's activity, is considered strictly confidential unless the company's management expressly declares otherwise.
- The student is reminded of articles 321 and 162 of the Swiss Penal Code:
 - **Article 321 (1)** : "...seront punis de la même peine les étudiants qui auront révélé un secret dont ils avaient eu connaissance à l'occasion de leurs études. La révélation demeure punissable alors même que le détenteur du secret a achevé sa profession ou qu'il a achevé ses études."
 - **Article 162** : "...celui qui aura révélé un secret de fabrication ou un secret commercial qu'il était tenu de garder en vertu d'une obligation légale ou contractuelle, celui qui aura utilisé cette révélation à son profit ou au profit d'une tiers, sera, sur plainte, puni d'une peine privative de liberté de trois ans de plus ou d'une peine pécuniaire."
- The teachers in charge of supervising and/or evaluating the work are bound by the duty of secrecy.
