


The Olin Business School CFAR Ranking of financial research provides information about the research output of the different universities, using the number of articles published in top journals that are relevant to the field reported by Business Source Complete and EconLit. The ranking considers articles published only by finance professors, or non-finance professors who have published at least three papers in the top three finance journals (JF, JFE and RFS).

 - ➤ Any course in the Finance or Law track can be selected as an elective course if not validated as a track course.
- > Master Thesis or Internship thesis (with oral defense), 18 ECTS

Elective courses

- Any course in the Finance or Law track can be selected as an elective course
 if not validated before as a track course.
- Elective courses can be taken in the first and the second part of the master.
- Given that 30 credits should be validated per semester, the ideal structure is as follows:
 - First semester: 2 core courses, 2 track courses, 1 elective course
 - Second semester: 2 core courses, 2 track courses, 1 elective course
 - Third semester : 2 core courses, thesis
- Please consult the study plan for a detailed list of elective courses that can be chosen. In case you want to deviate from the above structure, please contact the student counselor to ensure that it is consistent with the study plan.



New Courses

Winter Semester

- Instruments financiers et structures de détention (LAW)
- Mondays, 16h15-18h (Uni-Mail M R040), Professor Liégois
 This course explores legal aspects regarding financial instruments and common ownership structures in business, including stocks, bonds, derivatives, and structured products.

Spring Semester

- Philanthropy
- Fridays, 14:15-16:00 (Uni-Mail M 5189), Professor Ugazio

This course provides an introduction to philanthropy. The course also explores how behavioral science explains philanthropic decisions and elaborate on how data science can support philanthropic organizations in various ways.



Special Courses

Learning to Teach Finance A and B (6 ECTS)

- Objective: Give students the opportunity to develop teaching and research skills
- Under the close supervision of a professor, students will perform tasks such as
- 1. Tutoring and teaching assistantship: running exercise sessions and tutorials, marking assignments/essays/project presentation, elaborating education material/ case studies/webinar/ MOOC, external teacher coordination.
- 2. Research assistantship: research support, data warehousing.
- **3. Event organization:** Active participation in organizing important events including conferences, workshops, seminars.
- You can take either course A (Fall) or B (Spring), not both.

Thesis

 According to the study plan, thesis should be written in the 3rd semester

Thesis counts for 18 ECTS

Two options

- 1. Master thesis (under supervision of a professor)
- 2. Internship thesis (as part of an internship, primarily under the supervision of a practitioner)



Objectives of the Master Thesis

- The Master Thesis is the crowning achievement of your masters' studies
- It provides you with the opportunity to showcase your academic maturity
- The objective is to examine that you
 - have understood and assimilated the content of the courses
 - 2. are capable of **independently** structuring and writing a research paper



Master Thesis

- If you want to write a thesis with a professor in your third semester, you need to submit the 'Master Thesis Project Announcement' through the Master Platform by June 2nd
 - More information see official documents on GSEM website

 We will organize a separate information session on the master thesis during the Spring semester. (ZOOM)

Some advice regarding the thesis

- In case you want to write an "internship thesis", you need to find your own internship position. Start looking early!!
- Read the financial press (Financial Times, The Economist, Bloomberg, Wall Street Journal, etc.) to get a sense of what are currently "hot" (i.e., important) topics in economics, finance, and wealth management
- Go talk to professors after their lectures in case you are interested in writing a thesis in their area and discuss ideas with them
 - Do not ask them for ideas
 - Do discuss your own ideas with them and ask them what they think




