territorial scope: 78 % (18) national and 22% (5) sub-national; 100% of sub-national surveys conducted in cities

all surveys were **conducted for the purpose** of academic research, 26% (6) also to inform public policy and 30% (7) also for government statistics

all surveys are **representative** of the population

types: 44% (10) single cross-section, 26% (6) repeated cross-section, 30% (7) longitudinal/panel

target population: 91 % (21) adults (18+ and 15+), 8% (2) elder population only (55+) top-5 categories of target population: German, foreigners, Turkish, migrants, Italians

74% (17) **designed as** migrant and minority surveys, 26% (6) designed as general population survey 44% (10) include a **subgroup of the majority population**, 56% (13) do not include one

Top-5 topics covered: "citizenship and naturalization", "labor market integration", "demographic characteristics/behaviors", "educational attainment/trajectory, human capital, skills", "family relations"


sampling method: 74% (17) random sampling/ selection; 26% (6) mixed sampling procedures

overall response rate:

national: min. 22.6% max. 62% sub-national: min. 22.2% max. 47.5%

2 most-used **collection modes**: 65% (15) web/email and 61% (14) telephone 65% (15) **questionnaire** in migrant language

52% (12) **available** for download/direct access, 30% (7) with restrictions, 18% (4) not accessible



23 surveys

were identified:

- a. through a systematic search in the existing social science data archives: FORS, BFS
- b. by contacting the main research on ethnic/migrant minorities – NCCR on the move, Swiss Forum for Migration and Population Studies, Swiss Network of Young Migration Scholars
- c. through targeted Google searches
- d. by directly contacting researchers who published work using selfcollected data

Though the time-coverage frame allowed going back to 2000, the earlier surveys we retrieved were collected 2006-2007.

The latest survey we recorded was collected

All national and sub-national level surveys addressed to EMM (ethnic and migrant minority) respondents were included irrespective of the sample size.

National-level population surveys were included if they covered a well-suited topic for the study of integration. The website of the EMM Survey Registry:
