EMERGENCIES

IN ANY SITUATION

- Inform the emergency services of the intervention address: building, floor, and room number
- Send someone to meet the emergency services at the specified address
- Always inform internal security: +41 22 379 1222 or 1222 (internal number)
- Remember to save this number in your contacts!

FIRE, CHEMICAL, BIOLOGICAL OR RADIOACTIVE INCIDENT, FLOOD, GAS LEAK

If people are injured or in imminent danger:

Fire and rescue service: 118

Without injury or imminent danger:

FFFI ING OF INSECURITY

- Presence of people unrelated to university activities
- · Theft, incivility, vandalism, assault, break-in

ATTACK ON THE COMMUNITY - AMOK

Direct or imminent threat from an individual using weapon(s); the subject is still active and not under control.

- 1. Protect vourself take shelter, barricade accesses
- 2. Alert 117 (police) then +41 22 379 1222 (internal security): Indicate Where. Who. What. How.
- 3. Manage protect your group
- 4. Wait and Respect Remain discreet and follow the directions of the emergency services.

ANOMALY, INCIDENT OR NEAR-MISSES



DEFINITION

internal security: +41 22 379 1222 or **1222** (internal number)

Anomaly: risky situation, without material damage

Incident: material damage only

Near-misses: undesirable event causing no damage

FVACUATION



When the evacuation alarm sounds:



- Stop your activities immediately.
- · Ensure your neighbors have heard/understood the message and offer your help to those who need it.
- For those responsible for study areas (e.g. classrooms, computer rooms, auditoriums, laboratories, and libraries) ensure occupants have heard the message and are evacuating according to the instructions



· Close doors and windows. If possible, lock offices and laboratories.



· Leave the building following the evacuation signs.



· Only use stairs, emergency exits, or secure waiting areas for those unable to evacuate independently.



Do not use elevators.



- . Go to the assembly point indicated on the "evacuation instructions" panels.
- · Stay away from the building facades.
- Remain at the assembly point until further information is provided.



· Do not re-enter the building without permission.

PREVENTION - SECURITY



For your safety, university buildings are equipped with video surveillance systems.

IN CASE OF THREAT

SPECIFIC AND IMMINENT THREAT

Armed attack, hostage-taking, abduction, suicide threat, etc.:

- · Protect vourself
- · Alert those around you

WITHOUT IMMEDIATE DANGER

Speech, writing, gesture, or threatening behavior, aimed at a specific person and causing a feeling of insecurity:

PREVENTING THEFT

- Keep a close eye on your belongings in libraries, auditoriums, cafeterias, and laboratories (e.g. phones, laptops, wallets, and other personal items).
- · Lock your office even for brief absences.

LOST AND FOUND

Found items in university buildings should be reported as soon as possible to the front desk of the building.

In case of lost item:

• Contact the front desk of the building where the item was lost.

The smoking ban also applies to electronic cigarettes.

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH

The University of Geneva is responsible for applying a prevention concept involving occupational health physicians and other safety specialists (MSST).

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY

Risk analyses are systematically carried out by STEPS specialists within faculties presenting specific risks.

Periodic audits are conducted to check the implementation of preventive measures and to update the hazard inventory.

These specialists can be consulted for any questions regarding the work environment, any nuisance likely to affect physical safety and health, and must be informed in case of an accident.

ERGONOMICS

Screen work:

- Sedentary behavior, sitting position and risks
- Workstation setup





Physical activity and strain:

- Lifting and repetitive movements
- Posture and useful equipment

WASTE MANAGEMENT

The University organizes the collection of waste and ensures environmentally respectful disposal.

SPECIAL WASTE

"Special waste" refers to waste that is toxic or hazardous to health and the environment, generated by laboratory activities and other hazardous activities. These include:

Radioactive substances	Biological waste	
Solid chemicals	Liquid chemicals	
Various glues or gels	Acids and solvents	
Photo products	Pharmaceutical products	
Lubricants	Used oils	
Batteries	Cutting water	
Contaminated packaging		

The STEPS service handles their packaging, storage, transport, and necessary administration.

RECOVERABLE WASTE

The university provides users with collection points to sort and recycle recoverable waste as much as possible.

Depending on the infrastructure of different buildings, the following waste is collected:

Paper and cardboard

Sagex (expanded polystyrene)

PP (polypropylene): racks and tip boxes

Coffee capsules (e.g. Nespresso)

Batteries

Fluorescent tubes

IT equipment, electrical and electronic equipment

Aluminium

PET (polyethylene terephthalate)

Flexible PE (polyethylene): transparent and colored packaging films

Toners and printer cartridges, CDs

Mobile phones, tablets and chargers

Bulky waste
